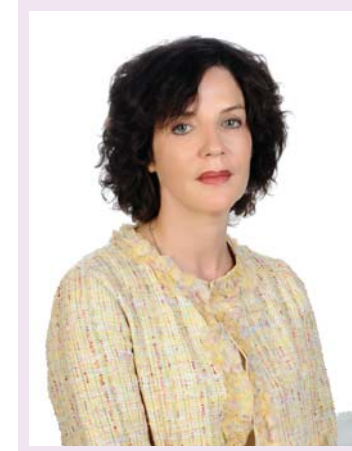

Guest Lecture on Coaching and Mentoring by Ms. Doris Martin, Director of Students' Affairs



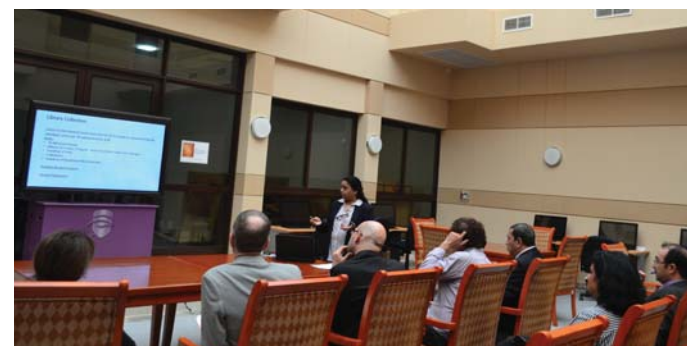
On September 27, Ms. Doris Martin, Director of Students' Affairs, was invited to the Coaching and Mentoring Course (HUR 426) to share her experience with the students. Ms. Martin has a huge experience in Management specifically in the area of Consulting, Coaching and Mentoring being a Senior Management Consultant dealing with International Organizations and Consulting Firms. Ms. Doris, Had an interesting way of engaging students, she discussed the main components of coaching and she emphasized the importance of active listening and interpersonal communication.

Session on Academic Advising



A session on Academic Advising conducted for the academic staff by Dr. Mona Suri, Academic Vice President, and Mr. Sami Dagash, Registrar was held on September 22. Dr. Suri stressed that Academic Advising is an essential component of the educational process at RUW. Academic Advising includes assistance with course selections and registration, a review of graduation requirements, an examination of internship and job opportunities and a periodic review of student progress toward goals. The revised study plan template was also discussed which will assist the advisors and students in registering for courses in each semester. Dr. Suri stressed that the advisor should meet with the advisees at least four times in a semester; at the time of registration, before and after the mid-term exams and before the final exams. Furthermore, the role of Advisor, advisee, college and Office of Registrar was also discussed. Mr. Sami emphasized on the effective use of self service in academic advising. The credit requirements for completion and graduation, probation policy, credit transfer were also discussed with the faculty members.

Library Orientation



Two Library Orientation Programmes were conducted by the library in the month of September: one to faculty members on September 15 and one to students on September 27. Faculty members were introduced to library collection, databases available, and provision of searching library collection along with library rules and regulations. They were also introduced to the procedure of ordering books and HEC compliance requirements. Students were informed about the collection, services and databases, searches on OPAC of library holdings, lending provisions and the training workshops organized by the library for skill enhancement.

RUW Library Organizes a Workshop on Turnitin



On September 27, a workshop on 'Turnitin' was organized by the library with Mr. Ilyes Hariza, Professional Academic Consultant for 'TechKnowledge' as a resource person. 32 faculty members attended the workshop. Staff was introduced to the new version of Turnitin with 'Feedback Studio'. They were explained about the types of assignments; optional settings and creating rubric in detail. Faculty was appraised of and shown the latest provisions of giving direct detailed feedback to students on the assignment itself.

CBFS Specific Students Orientation

On September 19, The CBFS hosted an orientation session for newly admitted students. A total of 25 students attended the orientation session. Dr. Hala Elias, Dean of CBFS welcomed the new students and introduced the CBFS faculty present. Dr. Hala Elias provided an overview of the College, programmes offered, graduation requirements, and expectations from new students, rules of attendance and class behavior, cell phone use and other related issues. Dr. Hala urged the new students to maintain the decorum of the College. Dr. Hala also spoke about the career opportunities to students graduating with a banking and finance, human resources, international business and marketing degrees. She also presented the different events and activities which are held by the college. Further Dr. Vivien spoke about the advising system and urged students to meet with their advisers frequently. He also discussed the international collaborations which exists between the college and its partners.

CBFS Specific Staff Orientation

On September 22, The College of Business and Financial Sciences held its college specific staff orientation. Dr Hala welcomed the college members to the orientation event for the AY 2016-17. Dr. Hala welcomed Dr. Bode (the only new faculty joining the college) to the college in particular and RUW in general. She presented the CBFS organizational chart and explained the composition of the two departments. Dr. Hala then continued with a discussion on expectations from college members and the composition of the workload. Dr. Arpita further discussed the general guidelines such as: Program Handbook, Course Folders, Assessment Policy, Academic Advising, Study Plan, Relationship with students, and Office hours.

CGS Orientation Session



On September 19, The Centre for General Studies held its specific orientation session. The acting director Ms. Norhan Abdulrahman introduced Ms. Orla and Ms. Bridget to the students. They covered the student handbook and the student rules and regulations. The policies of the CGS were also covered. The course content and schedule of RWC 101 and 201 and LSC 101 and 201 were elaborated by Ms. Norhan. Assessment policies, midterm and final exams were also outlined in detail. Students asked questions about the course and the university which were answered comprehensively by various members of the team.

Workshop on Self-Service and E-Learning Opportunities

On September 22, a Workshop on how to use Self-Service conducted by the Registrar and System Administrator, Mr Sami Mohd, for the academic staff. Self-Service is an Internet software system designed to provide students, faculty, administrators, and other members of an educational institution's learning community with "anytime, anywhere" access to information services. Main topics covered in the workshop: Set up Course Home Pages, Advising of Students, Enter Attendance, and Enter students' grades. On September 25, a Workshop was held on how to use Self-Service conducted by Mr Sami Mohd for the newly joined students. Main topics covered in the workshop: Logging into Self-Service, Registering for Courses, View Course Schedule, View Unofficial Transcript, Accessing a Course Home Page, and View Grade Report.

CAD Master's Program Orientation Session



On September 24, The College of Art and Design held an orientation session for its Postgraduate Studies students for the Master of Design Management and Master of Fine Arts in Drawing and Painting. The orientation was attended by RUW President, Professor Mazin Jumaah, AVP, Dr. Mona Sure, CAD faculty members, the CAD students' representative, and the new and returning Masters students of both programs. Dr. Janon Kadhim, Dean of CAD began the session by welcoming all new and returning students to RUW. She then introduced Prof. Mazin Jumaah and requested he address the group. Prof. Jumaah welcomed the students and spoke of the importance of their decision to continue their post graduate education is, and the relevance of them choosing RUW to pursue this degree.
