During the visit, RUW president received trophy from University of Nicosia President. Both parties continued cooperation discussion as they recognized the commonalities of Cyprus and Bahrain, both islands, with a similar population with one public university and a few private universities. English for Academic Success Students’ Orientation

More than 30 new students and six returning students attended a formative orientation session lead by the CGS Director, Dr Eugenie Samier on 14th of September 2015. Dr Samier presented to the students the nature of the program they have joined. She also introduced them to their English lecturers and highlighted the program’s requirements and expectations. After the session, the students asked questions that were addressed by CGS team.

Workshop on Academic Advising

On September 17, a Workshop on Academic Advising conducted by Dr Mona Suri, Academic Vice President, was held for the academic staff. Dr Suri stressed that Academic Advising is an essential component of the educational process at RUW. Academic Advising includes assistance with course selections and registration, a review of graduation requirements, an examination of internship and job opportunities and a periodic review of student progress toward goals. The revised study plan template was also discussed which will assist the advisors and students in registering for courses in each semester. Dr Suri stressed that the advisor should meet with the advisees at least four times in a semester; at the time of registration, before and after the mid-term exams and before the final exams. Furthermore, the role of Advisor, advisee, college and Office of registrar was also discussed.

Library Orientation



Three Library Orientation Programmes were conducted by the library in the month of September:

On September 10, the Library Orientation was conducted for the faculty members. It was divided in to two parts: first, familiarising faculty with - Library Rules and Regulations, Book Purchase Templates and procedures and also familiarising faculty with online library and online databases. On September 14, the Library Orientation was conducted for the new students. The students visited the library in three groups and were made aware of library arrangement of books on the shelves, categories of books, seating space and other procedures. The students were provided with the Library Brochure.

On September 29, the detailed exposure to library resources, library rules and regulations and the loan policy were given to the students, familiarising them with how to search the library catalogue online from the Library link and Quick link. They were also given an exposure to online databases along with a workshop schedule.

Royal University for Women Conducts Safety & Fire Training



On September 17, The Royal University for Women conducted a training session for its selected fire and safety procedures for the academic year 2015/16/. The session in coordination with the Electricity & Water Authority is part of RUW’s plans to raise the level of awareness on fire safety and security procedures at the university. A Senior Engineer from Industrial Security & Safety Directorate provided a thorough and extensive presentation regarding all the possibilities of fire, hazards, accidents as well as the following:

- Basic definition of Hazard, Safety and Accident.
- How to spot and control hazards.
- Fire Triangle.
- Methods of fire spread & Classes of fire.
- Actions taken in case of fire and more.

The Safety and fire training was very informative, useful and it provided awareness to prevent any unfortunate events which could occur, whether it is in the office or at home.
