Dear Students and Colleagues,

Welcome to second semester of this Academic Year 2016/2017! College of Law achieved so many goals during the last few years and it is now consolidated as a unique Law programme in Bahrain. Our Law Clinic activities have become a must for Law students who have the opportunity to interact with Lawyers from local and international Law firms based in Bahrain, discussing real legal cases which are pending in local courts. A number of guest lectures and field trips took place during the first semester and more events are scheduled in Semester 2. Amongst them, the Crime Scene Investigation and Criminology Workshop, organized in cooperation with Advanced Security Academy and scheduled on 23-24 April, will be the prominent activity opened to the whole legal community in Bahrain. The international learning experience of Law students has been enhanced through the participation, for the second consecutive year, in the annual Willem Vis Moot Court competition in commercial arbitration. The RUW Moot team has already achieved an important goal in this year's edition of the MENA Pre-Moot held in Kuwait, through the recognition of the award for best respondent memorandum. This follows last year's extraordinary success when RUW team scored 3rd out of the 13 Law teams participating in the regional competition and received 2 out of the 5 awards available. The College also proudly witnessed a recognition of excellence for one of its students, Ms. Sara Jassim Abdulla, awarded with the first prize of the Supreme Council for Women Research award during the conference on "Women and Law" for her research on Bahraini legislation addressed to women. College of Law is also working very hard towards the curriculum revision, in order to embed employability skills in the law programme and to match the current market needs. The draft new curriculum, developed in cooperation with our esteemed members of the College Advisory Committee, will be discussed with representatives of foreign universities and members of the Bahraini legal community next May in order to be finally approved. In addition to that, the whole Academic body is working towards the mapping of Law courses against the National Qualification Framework. New and more exciting challenges are yet to come and I am sure that the College of Law will be able to achieve the best results that our students deserve.

EU delegation chose to visit RUW as a model for Higher Education in the Gulf



On March 16, 2017, a delegation from the European Union Middle East / Gulf Working Group representing twenty member states chose to visit Royal University for Women as part of a field visit to the Kingdom of Bahrain. It was an opportunity for both sides to meet and discuss about setting up new joint initiatives including opening of new academic institutions for the benefit of as many students as possible". Mr. Alexis Koustantopoulos, Deputy Head of the EU Delegation to KSA and Bahrain and Ms. Antonette Cefai, representative from the 2017 Malta Presidency of the Council of the EU took the stage to thank RUW and mentioned their keen interest to engage deeper cooperation between the EU and Bahrain and with RUW. Following the visit, Dr. Mazin sent a thank you and follow up letter to initiate cooperation to the chairman of the Working group, Mr. Roberto Storaci. Mr. Storaci responded that "the Group highly appreciated the chance to visit the Royal University for Women during the trip to Bahrain" and would share the letter with the group and the competent Division in the European External Action Service (Diplomatic corps of the EU).
