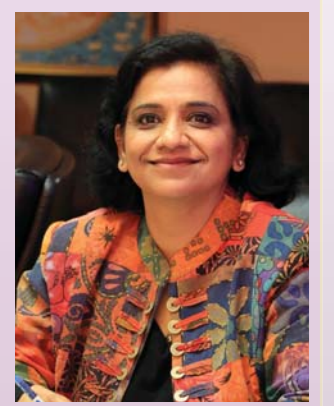


Welcome Note from the Academic Vice President

Faculty Of The Month

Dr. Matthias Bode, Associate Professor,
College of Business & Financial Sciences



Dr. Matthias Bode

Dr. Matthias Bode earned his business economics diploma in Germany (University of Hannover). After that, he focused in his PhD work on the role of music in business communications. He has been teaching for more than 16 years Marketing, Brand Management, Consumer Research, Advertising and Consumer Culture Theory at universities in Germany (University of Hannover; University of Oldenburg; Bauhaus University Weimar), in the USA (University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign) and in Denmark (University of Southern Denmark). Since 2007 he worked at the University of Southern Denmark, first as a visiting lecturer, then as an Assistant Professor, and since 2010 as an Associate professor. He worked for the European Union project on sustainable households, developing and executing research in several European countries with multi-stakeholders on the consumer acceptance of future oriented solutions to make household activities like washing, cooling, heating, more sustainable. He has also experience as an advisor for audio branding consulting. In his academic research he asks the question how marketing is shaped and shaping the cultural, social and historical context it comes from and acts upon. He published a book together with Prof. Dr. Ursula Hansen on the history and development of marketing theory and practice in Germany. With the same co-author, he also published one of the first German academic contributions on the role of gender in marketing theory.

He has published widely in international journals and books, served as a member of program committees for international conferences, participated in numerous global conferences, and is serving as a reviewer for international conferences and journals. Dr. Matthias Bode has a strong personal and professional interest in sound and music. He follows the Austrian late-Romantic composer Gustav Mahler, who declared that the most important part of music is not to be found in the notes.

Ties Strengthened , Announcement of Degree and Strategic Partnership Consolidated**



Royal University for Women hosted West Virginia University delegation led by Chairman of the Board of Governors, Mr. Thomas Flaherty and University President Dr. Gordon Gee from October 23 to 28, 2016 in a testament to the cooperation and strong strategic partnership between the two leading universities. The visit followed the approval of the renewal of the Memorandum of Understanding by the Higher Education Council in July 2016. The visit provided the perfect opportunity to highlight the progress and go forward with a number of key projects since the inception of partnership between both institutions. During the five day visit a series of agreed upon key projects was announced starting with a West Virginia University Bachelor of Civil Engineering at Royal University for Women to be launched in September 2017 in compliance with The Higher Education Council of Bahrain and the Higher Learning Commission in the United States. West Virginia University also announced its decision to choose Royal University for Women as a base and the Kingdom of Bahrain to launch its first Global Portal to serve the needs of West Virginia University in the Gulf region and the Middle East. WVU President Gordon Gee and Chairman of the Board of Governors, Mr. Thomas Flaherty also thanked the Royal University for Women, RUW management, faculty members and students for their financial contribution on the flooding relief effort following tragic flood in the State of West Virginia.

During the visit the delegation met with HH Shaikh Mohammed bin Mubarak Al Khalifa, Deputy Prime Minister. Esteemed Chairman of the RUW Board of Trustees, Mr. Fahad Al Zamil and Chairman of the WVU Board of Governors Mr. Tom Flaherty presented the intentions and commitment of cooperation from both sides to His Highness. His Highness welcomed the initiative of offering a Bachelor of Civil Engineering and other disciplines from a reputable American institution such as West Virginia University in collaboration with well recognized university such as Royal University for Women. As the delegation met with H.E. Shaikh Mohammed bin Khalifa bin Ahmed Al-Khalifa, Minister of Energy and his senior staff, the discussion touched upon the importance of engineering needs in the Kingdom of Bahrain and the region, and the necessity of linking the programme with the demands of the industry. During their visit at the Higher Education Council, H.E. Dr. Muna Al Baloochi, the General Secretary of the Higher Education Council briefed the delegation about the importance of academic and administrative compliance requirements and the types of disciplines needed in Bahrain. On the last day of their visit, both institutions teams met with H.E. Mr. Khalid Amro Al Rumaihi, Chief Executive, Bahrain Economic Development Board. Mr. Khalid showed his full support for the cooperation initiatives stating that "education is a key component in a services based economy such as the Kingdom of Bahrain".

H.E. Ambassador William Roebuck, US Ambassador to the Kingdom of Bahrain also met with the delegation and welcomed the progress of the cooperation translating the commitment to Higher Education of both countries. At the end of the visit, both leadership teams agreed upon a roadmap for the next five years.

RUW Library Organizes Workshops on Library Resources

During the month of October, library took three sessions with CAD, CBFS and Masters students providing information on library facilities, services and resources. Showing them the links to access library holdings using different links and the available loan facilities. They were also introduced to the databases available and the information available therein. Four workshops were done (2 each on ProQuest and Ebrary) with CAD and LAW students, introducing them with search strategies and making pinpointed searches. Further, the provision of saving searches in 'My Research' and 'Book shelf' along with use of 'highlighters' and inserting 'notes' was also shown. One 'Turnitin' training workshop was done with FDN students of CAD to familiarize them with process of submitting assignments.

CAD Programmes Review by the National Authority for Qualifications and Quality Assurance for Education & Training

Commencing on October 31, QAAU hosted the reviewers from National Authority for Qualifications and Quality Assurance for Education & Training (QQA) who visited RUW for a review of four programmes within the College of Art and Design; Fashion Design, Graphic Design, Interior Design and Design Management. The three-day visit was conducted by a panel of eight international members in addition to Review Directors and representatives from the QQA. In addition to the review of the programmes and their quality processes, the panel members had meetings with internal and external stakeholders including the Advisory Committee members, alumnae, students, employers and external examiners/verifiers. The visit was wrapped up with a positive verbal feedback, and the final official feedback will later be submitted to the university for factual accuracy.

CAD Field Trip to Seef Mall



On October 17, CAD organized a field trip to Seef Mall as part of a research project to design a Lobby in a Mall. Ms. Furat, architect at Seef Mall, provided an AutoCAD drawing of the floor plan of Seef mall to be considered as a floor plan for this class project. The trip was to verify measurements, and information relevant for this project. The students asked to take some pictures to assist them in their design sketching. Concepts and design requirements conducted with the architect and the manager of the mall, which is reflected somehow on students understanding about the role of designers in creating a public space, taking in consideration lighting, flooring information desk and the space itself. At the end the manger and the architect was invited to take part at the final presentation as juries.

CAD Field Trip to Roche bobois Interior Design Firm



On October 9, CAD organized a field trip to Roche bobois Interior Design Firm. Roche bobois is a French company dating to 1950. They create exclusive handmade furniture based on the design by world-known designers for example by Jean Paul Gautier, Sonia Rykiel, and Missoni as their designers. The showroom is in Seef and The Manager is Ms Kanwal. She had prepared presentation and a tour of the showroom with impressive pieces of furniture and artworks. The presentation was about the history of the company and she introduced many pieces with environmental sustainability features, something that Roche bobois incorporate in the making of their furniture and artwork. All students received a book on the latest collection of Roche Bobois furniture. Students were offered to get in touch with Ms Kanwal if they need more information for future projects.

CAD Field Trip to Bahrain Art Center

On October 23, a field trip with 14 students of Master of Design Management program was organized to visit an exhibition titled "Parallels" at Bahrain Art Center, about things that do not meet. Under the theme of "parallels never cross over, they never meet" in geometry, the show questions if lines must meet to create a perspective reflecting the concept of "if people must be the same to create a society." Three young Bahraini artists, an architect, a musician and a scenographer created five different installations that reflect a variety of social aspects from their point of view. After meeting one of the artists as a guest lecturer followed by a discussion where all students participated effectively, each student has been asked to produce a written critical essay of two pages about the concept of each work and the theme of the whole exhibition considering the materials used to create this work, supported by images.

CGS Field Trip to Bahraini National Museum



On October 19, Dr. Shaheen and Ms. Bridget facilitated a field trip for the History of Bahrain students. They visited the Bahraini National Museum. Students received an instructive and eclectic tour of the museum via museum staff and Dr. Shaheen himself, exploring exhibits on the earliest history of Bahrain with the Dilmun civilization, traditional Bahraini life, and modern 20th century music. Students paid particular attention to the Dilmun exhibit to write a report on an interesting finding for their class.

Presentation on "Academic Integrity"



On October 26, Ms. Bridget Hansen, Fulbright Scholar at the CGS, RUW, delivered a highly informative presentation on the topic 'Academic Integrity'. Students were educated on the nature of this topic and why it is important to respect this at all times during their academic career. They were shown a video on how to avoid plagiarism and given a questionnaire to check their understanding of the subject.

German Expert Prof. Stephan Kull in a talk on Consumer Target Groups

On October 20, as part of the CSR Class (BUS 433), Prof Dr. Stephan Kull, the German expert in CSR and Stakeholder Management held a talk over Skype, discussing the changes and current situation of the consumer target groups in West-Europe. One focus was on LOHA's (Lifestyle of Health and Sustainability). Another focus was on the role of regionality as a sustainable market element. This was a good contribution to the class, as the students could get an expert view on sustainable factors in the German market and a discussion developed, how such developments are different in the GCC area and why they are different.

Guest Lecture – CBFS students cued in on Marketing Tactics and Consumer Research

Dr. Matthias Bode, Royal University for Women Associate Professor, who also has over 20 years of experiences in practical and academic consumer research, was a guest lecturer in class BUS205 on October 20. In this marketing class, Dr. Matthias was presenting an overview on the discipline of consumer research, covering especially psychological but also sociological and cultural consumer research and related the research to practical Marketing applications. Areas that were covered included: affective, cognitive research, individual and group related research, as well as research techniques like focus groups and eye tracking.

Engaging Discussion on Oil Prices and the GCC Economies

On October 25, Mr. Osama Mohammed Moeen, a regional and international capital markets expert, discussed the economic background role of oil prices for the economic development in several of the GCC economies. Mr. Moeen has 29 year experience in this field and is engaged in several Global Investment houses and is also involved in major IPO's and new listings in Bahrain Bourse. The students were engaged and enjoyed this opportunity to get deep insight information about one of the most important topics for the economic and social development of the region in the past, present and future. The session ended with a discussion and question and answer session between Mr. Osama Moeen and the students.

Personal Development Workshop: Build Your Dream Life with Top 10 Success Habits



On October 25, Office of Student Affairs and Dr. Nehal Elnagar organized Personal Development workshop "BUILD YOUR DREAM LIFE WITH TOP 10 SUCCESS HABITS" by Ms. Huma Ahmed Life Coach (CLC | CSFC | CTC), Motivational Speaker. The workshop elaborated on how Success is not an overnight phenomenon and that it is build step by step based on a life of disciplined habits. College of Law Alumnae Meeting

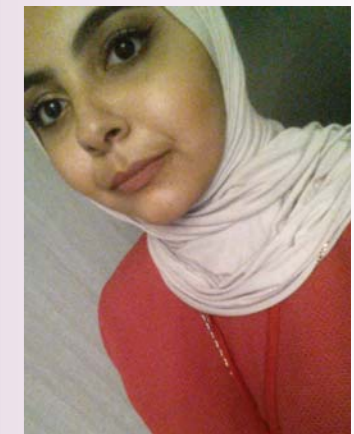
