Dear Colleagues and Students,

Greetings! As your new Acting President, it gives me great pleasure to welcome all our new and returning colleagues and students back to campus for the start of another, exciting academic year. I very much look forward to meeting each and every one of you. Universities throughout the world are facing enormous challenges – budget cuts, low student enrollment, fierce competition for international students – and are becoming more market driven. In this climate in which education is treated more and more as a commodity, I want to share with you (as we begin this academic year) some thoughts from John Henry Newman's classic work *The Idea of a University* (pub. 1852 and 1858).
"An academical system without the personal influence of teachers upon pupils, is an arctic winter; it will create an ice-bound, petrified, cast-iron University, and nothing else" (From *Historical Sketches*, Volume III, "The Rise and Progress of Universities," Chapter I, Section 6, John Henry Newman). We can all speak about Professors and teachers who have been great mentors to us and had a profound impact on our personal growth. Without them, as Newman writes, our whole time at college would have been impersonal, lacked the spark it needed, or even been like an "arctic winter." We are now, faculty, staff, and students, in a position in which we, too, can return the gift (pay it forward) and be a mentor who has a profound impact on our colleagues around us and impart to them that spark which suddenly opens their eyes to a whole new world. Or, as Newman writes: "perceive in sights or sounds something beyond them." ("The Scope and Nature of University Education," *The Idea of a University* (1852).) As we begin the new academic year, let all of us – whether staff or student- do so with an awareness and commitment to be a true mentor and to ignite within each other a true desire for learning.

The work we are engaged in is invaluable, it is noble, and it is desperately needed. In a world full of prejudice, bigotry, isolationism, and building walls, it is education, as Newman again writes, "which gives a man a clear, conscious view of their own opinions and judgements, a truth in developing them, an eloquence in expressing them, and a force in urging them. It teaches him to see things as they are, to go right to the point, to disentangle a skein of thought to detect what is sophisticated and to discard what is irrelevant." (The *Idea of a University*, 1852). It is our work as members of a collegial environment dedicated to learning which will eventually bring humanity to see that we are all one, all equal, all important and to simultaneously enable us to appreciate and celebrate the wonderful diversity in the human race. So yes, our work (faculty, staff, and students - because we are all educators in a university setting) is noble and important.

So, in the midst of the market driven forces which are hovering over education worldwide, let us, along with John Henry Newman, take pride in the work we do, celebrate the work we do, and enter worlds of thought we have never entered before. As Newman writes again, "Fear not that thy life shall come to an end, but rather fear that it shall never have a beginning." Let us make sure that as faculty, staff, and students we come together and experience the joy of learning and keep a vibrant, energetic, collegial life at RUW.

Dr. Amine Moulay is an Assistant Professor in Urban Planning and Design. He received his bachelor's degree from the Polytechnic School of Architecture and Urbanism in Algeria. Then he continued with two master's degrees: First an MBA, Master in Business Administration, with a major in project management from ESAA (Consortium with HEC Paris, ESCP Europe, Euromed Marseille and Lille 2 University); second, a Master of Philosophy in Urban Planning and Design followed by a Ph.D in the same major from the University Putra Malaysia (UPM), Malaysia. He has both professional experience (creating his own building company in Algeria) and academic experience (Assistant Professor at Royal University for Women and Scientific Researcher in University Putra Malaysia). His main areas of research are Urban Design, Interior Design, Quality of Public Places, Place Attachment, Architecture, and qualitative methodology through studying the non-positivist paradigm. He published several papers in Q1 and Q2 journals with a high impact factor, and participated in several international conferences. Architectural Design Students Conduct Site Visits



On September 24th and 25th, Dr. Sherif Khashaba, Associate Professor of Architecture took year three and four architecture students on a proposed design site visits. On the 24th, year three students went to an office building in the Seef area. On the 25th, year four students were taken to a building site for a general hospital in the Sanabis area. Students of both levels will work to design the designated sites within their courses. Site visits are educationally essential because they provides students accurate perception of the site and its dimensions. Activities such as this enable students to understand and realize the effect of environmental aspects such as the direction of the sun and wind. Furthermore, visits make it possible to identify the site problems, understand the sites advantages and disadvantages, identify the relationship between the site and its surrounding buildings and gain perception regarding the roadways adjacent to the site. It is important to study site accessibility and determine appropriate entrances to the building. Also, visiting a site allows students to study the architectural styles of the surrounding buildings which may assist them to easily create new designs through the architectural design process.

Site Visit to Down Town Manama

On October 23, Dr. Janon Kadhim and year five architectural Design Students went on a site visit to Down Town Manama as part of ARD 5162, Urban Design course (Architectural Design 7). The project focuses on developing an Urban Design solution for Down Town Manama, specifically the parking area across the street from the Old Souq. Students were assigned to collect as much information as they can from the site and surrounding areas for further analysis to design a layout proposal. Students appreciated the exposure of the project and they were interested and engaged in the survey. The assignment granted them the ability to utilize their knowledge towards a real urban sector in one of the oldest parts of downtown Manama. Information was gathered through photos, a number of interviews, and site study methods. For efficiency and focus, students were divided into groups and parts of the site were distributed amongst each group.

COL Delegation Visits International Law Firm DLA Piper Bahrain

On September 18th, a College of Law delegation comprised of Dr. Pasquale Borea, Dean of the College of Law, and Dr. Maria Casoria, Assistant Professor of Commercial Law, visited the DLA Piper Office in Bahrain and met with lawyers to discuss the MoU to be signed between COL and DLA Piper. The purpose of the MoU is to identify internship opportunities and possible avenues of cooperation between the firm and the College.
