


Governance



A Year of Success

Numerous accomplishments and activities were honoured by the students and staff of RUW.

Quality Achievements:

- MBA programme launched AY 2021-22, and the first cohort was successfully recruited.
- RUW qualifications titled Bachelor in Architectural Design and Bachelor of Business in
 Marketing were successfully placed on the NQF Register in October 2021.
- College of Law received a vote of 'Confidence' from BQA for its Law programme in October 2021.
- College of Business and Financial Sciences received a vote of 'Confidence' from BQA in March 2022 for its undergraduate programmes, Bachelor of Business in Banking and Finance, Bachelor of Business in International Business, Bachelor of Business in Human Resources and Bachelor of Business in Marketing.
- The Bachelor of Business in Banking and Finance, Bachelor of Business in International Business, and Bachelor of Business in Human Resources offered by the College of Business and Financial Sciences were re-validated by BQA in April 2022 and met the Validation Standards of NQF Mapping.
- RUW passed the ISO 9001:2015 re-certification audit for AY2021-22 in June 2022 with no non-conformances for the eighth consecutive year.




