

RUW signed an MoU with Green Innova Trading



RUW alumna, Aisha Abdulmalek, paid a visit to our MBA class.



<u>Research</u>

Efforts were directed towards fostering research output diversification across different departments and colleges within the university to achieve a more balanced research outcome were very successful. During the reporting period, a total of 25 publications were produced by faculty members of the university. Among the publications, 10 articles were published in Scopus indexed journals, accounting for the entirety of the university's publications within Scopus indexed sources. In terms of research quality, there has been a positive trend observed, as 40% of all research publications are now indexed in Scopus.

These findings shed light on the university's research productivity, highlighting the significant contribution of researchers particularly in terms of Scopus indexed publications.
